Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

All schools are required to collect information about the numbers of students that they provide adjustments to under the Disability Discrimination Act (1992) and Disability Standards of Education (2005). From 2018, this data will be used as the basis for national funding.

The NCCD involves the collection of;

- the number of students receiving adjustments to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students
- the level of adjustment provided to students
- student's type of disability if known

Under the model the definition of disability is broad and includes learning difficulties, health and mental health conditions.

If your child is identified for inclusion in the Collection, the required information will be included in this year's data collection.



Senior Leader's Message

Running records and PROBE testing has been completed in all classrooms again this term. All students are making progress in their levels. Students making significant progress are those students who are reading each day at home as well as at school. As this consolidates the skills they are learning in the classroom into practice. Being at school to learn and practice the skills being taught is an important aspect of the learning program. By the end of reception students should be above level 5, end of year 3 onto PROBE levels, year 5 PROBE 17, and year 7 PROBE level 20+. Together we can help all students make significant progress with their reading.

Thank you to everyone who encourages and reads with children at home. School holidays is a chance to have a break, however it is important that children read to maintain their skills and knowledge.

If you would like assistance on how to support your child at home with reading, please ask their teacher for ideas and strategies they have already learnt.
