This fortnight I have worked with teachers to analysis triangulation of student progress data. The data we have analysed has been attendance and various data on reading levels. Exploration of this data shows most students are making steady progress in their reading. I work with individual teachers to analyse what skills each student need to improve and then target these areas in the literacy program. Some of the areas where students need additional practice are uncommon diagraphs of the sounds, long vowel sounds and understanding what unfamiliar words are. However, students reading levels are being affected when they are regularly away from school more than one day a week. If you would like more information about where your child is at with their learning please be in contact with your child's teacher.
